

THE AGE OF APOSTASY

Let me begin with a word we don't often use "**apostate**." The Greek word literally means "to fall away from." The dictionary defines an apostate as... "a person who has rejected the tenets of the religion he once claimed to believe." In biblical terms, an apostate is anyone who claims to be a Christian, and yet denies the fundamental truths of the Christian faith.

You could say Jude is just an old book... but what we *really* have is a survival manual for believers in the days of apostasy... days like ours! What can we say about this little letter from Jude? In only 25 verses he dissects the lives of the apostates revealing their character, their doctrine, their moral error, and their ultimate destiny. Then he reveals how believers should respond to moral and spiritual apostasy.
