Various Scriptures

Many people have cried out to the heavens with all their might “*God, if you are real, prove it! We live in an empirical world where “seeing is believing.”*” Such was the case with Thomas (John 20:25).

The fact that “*God is spirit... and must be worshipped in Spirit and in truth*” (John 4:24) presents a whole set of challenges to the empirical worldview. God is invisible, and invisible is hard to touch. One of the great things about God is He knows us. He knows we are inquisitive and need to see, feel and touch. So that’s exactly what He did.

HE came to MY senses.

He empirically proved His existence when He BECAME FLESH and dwelt among us! We saw Him, touched Him, heard Him, smelled Him and tasted Him! Col. 1:15; Jn. 1:14; Phil. 2:6-8; Heb. 1:1-2. Jesus said... “*If you have seen me, you have seen the Father*” (Jn. 14:9).
