This morning, we conclude our study of the book of Habakkuk. The beginning of this book and the ending are very, very different. J. Vernon McGee says... Habakkuk "*begins with a <u>question mark</u> and closes with an <u>exclamation point</u>."*

In chapter 1, Habakkuk is saying, "God, I don't understand." In chapter 2, God said, "Be patient and wait." And even though things around him didn't seem to be getting any better, Habakkuk is at peace in chapter 3. And I want you to take note of this, nothing changed on the outside, but Habakkuk changed on the inside.

2. _____ what God is doing. (16: and 2 Corinthians 12:9-10)

3. _____ what God is going to do in the future. (16-18)
